

LAST MEETING

Curtis Thompson showed his range rider style cowboy hat 5 7/8 x 141/2 made of **Brazilian** pepper. No finish as yet so it's a work in progress. Plus a range rider cowboy hat of ash $161/2 \times 61/2$ sporting 6 coats of lacquer. Both are very nice.

Linda Emery brought 2 tops-one **Bonnie Klein** of tulip wood and a maple box. Very nice.

Carey Caires had an inch and 11/16 tall goblet of buckeye and a small box of buckeye. Good work. **Bill Noble** showed a bocote? box on pedestal. Well done.

Ralph Otte showed his **Tasmanian** burl bowl and a thimble of cocobolo and ebony with a fish paper spacer. Nice work. His thimble went 2nd place in the miniature challenge. Enough said.

Al Sils had a beautiful redwood burl vase with inlaid fused silver. Just great work.

Floyd Pedersen brought a segmented vase of ash, walnut, oak, cherry and cocobolo. Plus a redwood bowl. Nice Nice.

Don Comer came with a lidded box of pupleheart, pink ivory and brass inlay with lacquer finish. An absolute eye stopper.

Carl Stude showed his maple footstool and his ebony bowl $\frac{1}{4} \times \frac{1}{8}$ inch high. It took 1st place in the miniature Challenge. Enough said.




