


2000 CALENDAR

The Incredible Work of Don Comer

This hollow vessel is made of cocobolo with a copper wire inlay. The base and finial are made of bleached maple. It is 14 1/2 inches high and 2 3/4 inches in diameter. This piece is in the collection of **Dr. Irving Lipton**.



This woodturning consists of a hollow vessel made of ebony with a silver wire inlay. The base and finial are made of bleached maple. It is 14 1/2 inches high and 2 3/4 inches in diameter. It won a first place award in the **Design** In Wood Show at the 1999 Del Mar Fair and is currently in the permanent collection at the LA County Museum of Art.
