

Bill Pounds turned a nice hollow vessel made from olive wood. The shape and finish are perfect.



Pete Carta is perfecting his goblet turning skills. He turned six long stemmed goblets from ash and elm -- one made from a branch of a tree in his front yard. He

also showed three short goblets which are equally beautiful.

Michael Kane turned a tulip. He used piercing to create a lacy effect, and left a little caputre ring in the origional color of the wood. He also showed a stunning platter made from a carob tree cut down in Pasadena. And he also brought a beautiful sea spray goblet.
