

And an almost groaning table filled with sweet delights of the season.




There were lots of toys and goodies on display for the raffle.

FINISHING THOUGHTS

I want to try and keep things interesting for everyone, myself included, so starting with this issue I am giving you a new column to read. It will probably not appear every month but I hope you like it enough for it appear more than this once. We have lots of interesting people and their shops in our club and I thought I could sort of share them with you.

SHOP CHIPS

My first visit is with **Ed Hotchkin** at his spacious shop and auxiliary studio and storage space in a 1940 ranch style house in Pasadena. His main space takes up about two bays in his three car garage and then across the driveway, in what was an RV garage, he has set up a photography studio and he also has a rack with a substantial supply of wood for his future projects.





Ed and his wife Cathy moved to Pasadena on April 29th 1959 and he is now a retired electronics engineer. He started turning in 1997. His first three pieces were turned out of sycamore and he still has them on display in his house. His favorite wood to turn now is ash, mostly because it has beautiful straight grain; he also likes buckeye. His biggest piece to date was about 20 inches tall and about 16 inches in diameter with a ½ inch hole in the top and it was buckeye. He says he doesn't really turn anything useful, he likes to turn hollow forms and most have "useless small openings". Ed can sometimes get in as much as 4 to 5 hours a day at the lathe when all things are working in his favor. He has owned his Oneway lathe about 5 years now. Ed admits to being a bit of a "type A perfectionist. "

Ed has become our club "mentor" on coloring and even had a mini workshop on coloring for our Spaceport Project this year. He got really interested in coloring after seeing Binh Pho's work and then taking our club sponsored class with him. He likes to color a lot with light pink and blue or other pastel colors so the wood grain will still show through. These do best with very soft woods in general with lots of sanding. He uses cyanoacrylate adhesive to keep things together and he also uses CA as a finish a la Bill Haskell. He does not use stabilized woods or "unusual" woods to turn anything but he did once turn a piece of structural lumber.

Lest you think that all Ed does is turn all of the time, au contrarie; over the past dozen years or so Ed has been taking RV trips with his wife and researching his family tree. He now maintains 2 web sites for genealogy on his Hotchkin family and has over 11,000 people listed on his site. Now that is some kind of dedication!
