

CHALLENGE

There was a pretty good turnout for the annual round ball contest. We had a total of ten members enter with seventeen round ball contenders. Those with single entries were: Queen Carey Caires, Amy Earhart, Bob Fahrnbruch, Pat Bradshaw, Paul Schmit, Jim Givens and Bill Nelson. Members with multiple entries were: Jim O'Connor, Pete Carta, Terrell Hasker and Don Comer.



After the break the rolling rig and lane was set up by **Don Comer**, **Jim O'Connor** and **Jerry Davis**. The course was swept and a billiard ball was used to test and set a target. There were three preliminary runs for each ball and the three closest to the target went into the final roll off. The finalists were: **Pete Carta, Don Comer** and **Amy**

Earhart. Jim O'Connor disqualified himself from the final because he was using last years' winner. **Bill Nelson** was disqualified after the judges were "shocked" to learn that he had used a semi radio controlled ball in the contest. Terrell Hasker also showed a square edge bowl and five walnut natural and unnatural edge bowls.



Dave Hergesheimer brought in a nod to Halloween with his spider web vessel of brass and walnut with a CA and lacquer finish. It was kind of scary and definitely wicked.

Jim Givens brought in a marvelous double box turned from walnut with

a carob inlay on the lid. It had an oil finish.



Pete Carta brought in a kind of "search for the perfect finial". There were six hollow forms and different finials that ten were mostly

interchangeable. Food for thought.



And Steve Veenstra brought in two examples of what he has been up to lately. The first was a ficus bowl from the beginner's workshop and the second was a walnut vase; both were finished
