

Michael is looking to strengthen his store's relationship with all of the area woodworking clubs and guilds. There is going to be a large "Demo Day" at the store on the 18th of August in which he would like a strong presence from our club. I have agreed that we would be able to be there from 10:00 to 2:00 with a number of people to demo. He is very interested in the Freedom Pen Project and would like to see some pens being turned that day. In addition to the pens, it would be nice to also have some people who would be able to turn other pieces. Since we will not be too limited by space, it would be great if members would bring a few of their

finished pieces to put on some tables for display. Please contact me if you are interested in participating. I will be doing a half-day demo on Shell Inlay on a Sunday at the end of September. The demo will cover everything you need to know in order to get started adding shell inlays to your pieces. I will announce the firm date once the County gets back to me to confirm which date is available. **Douglas Fisher** will be doing an all-day demo for our club on the 28th of October. **Doug** is a very talented and creative turner from Vancouver Island, Canada, who has never been to Southern California. His demo will include the turning, texturing and off-center techniques that he uses in his work. Everyone should visit his website www.douglasjfisher.com to get a look at some of his work. I was able to catch one of his sessions at the AAW Symposium and I am sure that he will provide a great demo for the club.

CHALLENGE

We had a pretty good turnout for the challenge this month but we had to move an intermediate up to advanced temporarily for lack of intermediate entries.

Leading off in the Novice category, Vice President **Robin Brown** with his awl turned from a mystery burl and finished with Mylands.



New member **Chris Durkee** was the winner in the category with his **Avelino Samuels**' inspired bowl thickness gauges made out of aluminum.



Moved up temporarily to the Advanced category we led off with **Henry Koch** and his modified ½" scraper.



Sandy Huse brought in a piece she called "artifact number five"., it's made from Oak, steel and a magnet. It was finished with oil, acrylic and charcoal.



Dick Lukes brought in one of his signature hollow handled parting tools turned from Cocobolo. It features a hidden compartment for the allen wrench in the handle.



Carey Caires brought in some modified hollowing tools that were bought at Harbor Freight. And there were also some modified recycled dental picks.



Terrell Hasker brought in two hollowing tools that he made after getting the steel from Bob Devoe and then turning the Teak handles.



Bill Haskell brought in two Cocobolo handled branding pens that he made after reading **Molly Winton's** instruction book.



He also brought in a pair of large and small **Avelino Samuels**' calipers out of aluminum. And a thickness gauge that he also made.



The winner in the category was **Bob Ricard** with his pen tube tool. It was a rat tail file mounted on an Oak fixture and is used to get CA out of the inside of the brass pen tubes. Nice job Bob!



SHOW AND TELL

We had more great pieces for show and tell this month. We led off with VP **Robin Brown** and his Maple burl square top bowl. And his Norfolk Island Pine bowl, both finished with Waterlox.



Carey Caires brought in a Persimmon goblet, two Mahogany bowl/vases and an Ebony mini hollow form. All were finished with Mylands and buffed with carnauba wax.



Bill Haskell brought in "Sail #10", an elliptical vessel with a carved and textured design. It was turned from Iron bark Eucalyptus and finished with CA and matte acrylic.



Frank Kopecky brought in two of his latest pens. These were" bullet style" pens, one a click version and the other a twist style. They were turned from Dymondwood and Blackwood and finished with

Mylands.



Dan Hogan brought in a bowl and a platter turned from Alabaster with Maple rims and bases.



Scott Johnson brought in an Elm bowl that he thought was a bit thin walled so he practiced some piercing skills on it. Nice effect Scott!



Jack Stumph brought in a really nice Curly Maple platter that was finished with lacquer.



And last but certainly not least was Deanna Hemphill and her assorted lidded boxes. These were turned from Almond, Arbor Vitae, Walnut and raffle wood, They had various finishes. Nicely done!
