

Avelino showed us some good carving techniques that he uses to achieve his spirals on his hollow forms. He was very willing to share how he makes some very creative gauges that he has developed to assist in measuring the walls of his hollow forms. I look forward to making a starter set for my own use. If there are enough club members that would like to make these we could get together and have a gauge making day at someone's "studio". We followed up the very next day with our monthly meeting which also was well-attended. Many thanks to Bill Haskell for a very informative presentation on Surface Decoration; he showed many different tools and techniques for creating different effects on the surface of turnings. Unfortunately the participation in the challenge was rather slim. Remember that the purpose of challenge is as the name suggests, challenging yourself. I know how easy it is to fall into artistic ruts and keep doing the same old comfortable thing. If you do try some of these challenges you will find that your skills do improve and your enjoyment of turning increases. So let's

see if we can get better participation this coming month in the tool challenge. Bring in a tool that you have made that solves a problem for you. Start now making Plates, Platters and Saucers for the August challenge. The weekend following our meeting a number of us attended the AAW 2012 Symposium in San Jose. I had a very enjoyable time connecting with turners that I had not seen for a year. It was a real pleasure to see many demonstrations by turners that I had never seen. I especially enjoyed watching Jean François Escoulen show how he does some of his amazing off center pieces. His demo of how to make a trembleur was amazing due to both his speed and skill in using a bedan, which is used much like a skew but has some advantages due its shape. ### **SHOW AND TELL**

We had some great pieces for the show and tell this month. **Norm Leduc** brought us his display of five bottle stoppers, two made of Walnut and three of a color laminated wood.



**Norm** also brought in his *Majestic* pen.



**Henry Koch** brought in two pieces. The first was a Maple and Persimmon bowl and the second was an Olive bowl. Both were finished with wax.



**Floyd Pedersen** brought in two gorgeous bowls. The first was a segmented bowl and the second was a Manzanita bowl.



**Jim Givens** brought in a segmented Zebrawood and Ebony pencil box. He also had a Purpleheart bowl with carvings. Both were finished with CA and lacquer.

There was also a Maple platter inlaid with Ebony, Malachite, mother of pearl and abalone. And a third piece was a Beech off center goblet.
